## Health & Safety Highlights

**Description:** Currently Eagle-SWS has 59 field response individuals deployed and engaged in flyash containment and recovery operations associated with the release at TVA's Kingston facility. In this time Eagle-SWS has developed and implemented consistent health and safety practices which address the needs of our workers. We hope by drawing from this experience we would be most capable of communicating the hazards and countermeasures encountered in this setting while completing the services requested.

The work, in general, consists of the following:

- Provide HAZWOPER training in accord with 29CFR1910.120 and the specific requirements of sections (e)(3, 4, 5, 6, & 8);
- Training to consist of:
  - General site worker training (40-hour) up to 20 students per class, 8 classes;
  - Occasional site worker training (24-hour) up to 20 students per class, 8 classes;
  - Supervisor training (8-hour) up to 30 students per class, 3 classes; and
  - Annual refresher training (8-hour) up to 30 students per class.
- Train up to 150 personnel over a 7-consecutive week period; and
- Training may be either onsite or offsite.

The goal of providing such services is to give training to meet all of the requirements of 29 CFR 1910.120 (e)(3), (e)(4), (e)(5), (e)(6), (e)(8). The trainers will provide interactive courses with a mixture of delivery techniques to keep personnel actively participating in the training sessions. These courses include tabletop exercises, field exercises, and demonstrations for the proper donning, doffing, and use personal protective equipment.

This particular course is designed to complete the required training in 7 consecutive weeks. 10 hour training sessions are to be conducted Monday through Thursday to accommodate 40 hour training requirements. Those individuals participating in 24 hour training sessions will be released at noon on Wednesday. 8 hour training sessions are to be conducted on Friday for individuals participating in refresher and supervisor training.
